a. The Texas Tech University System (“System”) and its component universities (referred to herein collectively as the “University”) recognize freedom of speech and expression as a fundamental right and seek to ensure free, robust, and uninhibited debate and deliberations by students enrolled in the University, as well as other persons on this system’s campuses or expressive conduct protected by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution or by Section 8, Article I, of the Texas Constitution, and includes assemblies, protests, speeches, the distribution of written material, the carrying of signs, and the circulation of posters, leaflets, and other printed materials, as well as System and University policy.

b. For purposes of this regulation, expressive activities do not include commercial speech. As such, commercial activities are prohibited on University grounds without a prior written agreement with the University.
